Sound processor warranty and replacement







Sound processor - manufacturer's warranty

Your sound processor comes with a manufacturer's warranty. Please make yourself aware of the period and conditions of the warranty by referring to the Cochlear™ Warranty Guide in your sound processor's document pack. You can purchase extended cover - please visit the Cochlear Ltd website (www.cochlear.com) or ask your clinician if you are interested.

Sound processor replacement

Currently, there is no public funding for replacement or upgrade of sound processors for adults. As with most medical equipment, cochlear implant components are expensive to replace. If your sound processor is damaged beyond repair, lost or stolen, then you will need to consider purchasing a new device. We therefore strongly recommend that you consider options for replacement of a processor such as general household insurance cover.

Australian Hearing – processor replacement for children

The Commonwealth Government currently has a programme which can fund the replacement of sound processors for children who are eligible for the services of Australian Hearing and have a current Hearing Services Card. Please visit www.hearing.com.au for more information.

At present, there is no need for parents to personally insure their child's sound processor. We realise, however, that some parents may like to investigate other alternatives.





Insurance policies

We recommend that you make your own enquiries regarding the level of cover required for a sound processor, as it may need to be a specific addition to your home and contents policy. The following table provides some examples of companies that offer insurance for sound processors.

Points to note:

- Be aware that not all insurance companies will offer cover against theft, loss, fire and accidental damage. Be clear about the circumstances under which the device is **not** covered.
- Check if the device is covered when outside of the home. For example, it could get lost or damaged on the way to work.
- The Cochlear Implant Clinic can provide a letter for your insurance company outlining the costs of the components relevant to your sound processor if necessary.





Cost of components

The following table lists the current costs of Cochlear Ltd's sound processors. At present, Cochlear Ltd offers discounted prices for replacement sound processors. You might, however, like to consider covering your sound processor for the full market value. This offers you the possibility of considering a higher priced new model if you need to replace your sound processor in the future.

Sound processor up-grade

Adults over the age of 25 should consider private health insurance to cover the cost of upgrading their sound processor as upgrades are not funded by Australian Hearing beyond this age. However some funding is available from the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS), but is limited to particular locations.

Some private health funds will only cover the cost of an upgrade sound processor once an existing processor is beyond a certain age, for example over five years old. If you wish to purchase a new sound processor, please contact the Clinic for ordering details and costs.
