

# Eye and Ear on the Park St Andrews Place Transport

## How do I get to Eye and Ear on the Park?



### Where is Eye and Ear on the Park located?

Eye and Ear on the Park is located on the corner of St Andrews Place and Lansdowne Street. The main entrance is located at 2 St Andrews Place and has wheelchair access, and volunteer staff to assist you.

### Is car parking available?

Parking is available on-site at Eye and Ear on the Park at a reasonable cost. The car park entrance is located on Lansdowne Street, near the corner of St Andrews Place. Lifts operate at levels CP1 and CP3 of the car park. Patients or visitors with accessibility issues should use the car parking bays next

to the lifts on these levels. Access to the car park from the hospital is available from the lift opposite the main reception desk. Please note, the pay station is located inside the building on the Ground Floor.

Metered street parking surrounding Eye and Ear on the Park is limited to one and two hours, and parking officers regularly patrol the area.

## Taxis

A taxi can pick you up and drop you off just inside the main entrance off St Andrews Place. A free phone line direct to the taxi service is available and located on the ground floor near the Admissions Desk.

## Is public transport close to the hospital?

**Trains:** Parliament Railway Station is a 500 metre walk from Eye and Ear on the Park. Use the Macarthur Street exit, cross Macarthur Street at the pedestrian lights and walk along St Andrews Place. The entrance to Eye and Ear on the Park is on the left. This is a five minute walk.

**Trams:** Tram numbers: **11, 12, 109**  
Alight at stop 10 and walk along St Andrews Place.
